Hunger Action Month is a nationwide campaign that brings communities together to take action in the fight to end hunger — whether it's by volunteering, advocating for our neighbors facing hunger or donating. It is also back to school month for millions of children and college students of all ages. Our Food Bank of South Jersey said, "When New Jersey's 1.4 million K-12 students return for the new public school year in September, 60,000 more of them will qualify for free or reduced-price meals as a new state law kicks in, representing a new front in the State's efforts to curb food insecurity."

That is a result of advocacy, thank you! In the 2022-23 school year, some 340,000 New Jersey students had free or reduced-price breakfast at school on an average day, according to the Food Research and Action Center, a national advocacy group. About 628,000 had free or reduced-price lunch at school during that period. This news can't come soon enough for working and struggling families. We all go to the grocery store and know how expensive it is. That is why the emergency food pantry is critical to these families and critical to God, who speaks often on taking care of the poor. The Church was the Christian Caring Center's first partner and remains one of the strongest supporters with food drives, donations and special needs like clothing, cleaning supplies, hygiene drives, Holiday drives, coat/sweatshirt drives, etc.

All these wrap around services mean so much to each child, struggling parents, senior citizens and homeless individuals. As we invest in our future leaders at whatever grade or age they are in, we recognize their importance in the kingdom of God.

We send a huge thank you for your continued support. We can never do any of these programs without God and without God prompting your hearts to give. Thank you for being a part in building up the kingdom with us.

A Journey of Faith and Service: The Testimony of Wynn & Christine L. Faulkner

Wynn and Christine Faulkner are shining examples of what it means to live a life of faith, service, and generosity. As long-time supporters of the Christian Caring Center, their story is one of deep-rooted commitment to helping others and spreading the love

Wynn's journey of faith began at an early age as the son of a minister. After college, he was invited by a church planter to move to Passaic, New Jersey, to assist with a newly established church. He found a job and devoted himself to the ministry, embracing the opportunity to serve in various capacities.

Christine, on the other hand, grew up in a nominal Catholic home and, by her teenage years, had drifted away from the church. However, her story took a pivotal turn when her sister became involved in a Bible study outreach at the very same church where Wynn served. Encouraged by her sister to seek spiritual answers, Christine began attending Bible studies, which ultimately led her to give her life to Christ. It was through these gatherings that Wynn

and Christine met, and as they say, the rest is history. The couple was married in 1979, and a few years later, they embarked on a new adventure, spending several years in Japan as English teachers and missionaries. As we are open 5 days per week, we greatly need ovolunteers. We only have 9 regular staff (4 full time and 5 part time staff) to run 11 programs. Emergency Food

The Lord through the Christian Caring Center helped **341** families or **1,301** individuals with **23,418** meals in the month of August, 2024-PTL!!!

Community Lunch/Rural Homeless Program

The Lord through the Christian Caring Center served **966** hot cooked lunches and continental breakfasts in the month of August, 2024. We also go out to streets/woods on Wednesday and Friday to deliver **40** lunches and outreach to the homeless, alcoholic, addicted or mentally challenged men and women in 2 area motels. The Red Carpet is shut down for repairs and all guests are being relocated currently. Please continue to pray for the people still out there homeless and struggling as well as the staff and volunteers.

Salvation Army Service Units & Grants

The Christian Caring Center serves as a volunteer service unit for the Salvation Army and 3 other grants. Households with 28 individuals were helped with rent and 23 individuals were helped with security deposits. 59 nights of lodging were provided to 28 individuals and help with utilities was provided to 6 households with 10 individuals in August, 2024.
